

INFORMED SUPERVISION & CHAPERONE TRAINING

Counseling Service Associates offers Informed Supervision and Chaperone Training several times each year. The training is offered as a one day class with one individual follow up session for each participant. All participants are asked to take the Millon Psychological Exam (MCMI III) at the beginning of each training and sign a release of information for the appropriate supervisor and therapist. A variety of materials are used for educational purposes including: handouts; video and/or audio tapes; guest speakers; examples of polygraphs, PPG's, sexual offense descriptions and clarifications. A written evaluation with recommendations is provided for each participant upon completion of the training.
