

## Resources for Victim Representation

1. Victim's therapist on the specific case
2. Victim advocate with the offense specific treatment agency
3. Victim's Assistance Coordinator (VAC) in the Probation Department
4. Victim/Witness staff person at the District Attorney's Office assigned to the case
5. Victim Advocate with a local agency, such as a non profit sexual assault crisis center
6. Victim therapist who is willing to provide victims' perspective though s/he is not working with the specific victim on the case
7. Caseworker with the Department of Human Services assigned to the case
8. Guardian Ad Litem for the victim
9. Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) worker assigned to case
10. Friend or family member of victim whom MDT deems is suitable and appropriate to provide victim representation to the team
11. Victim Assistance Coordinator at the Division of Youth Corrections
12. Victim Assistance Coordinator at the Department of Corrections
