

Christine Adams has been with the Office of Research and Statistics since 2007. Christine is collaborating with DCJ's Office of the Domestic Violence Offender Management Board to validate the Domestic Violence Risk and Needs Assessment (DVRNA), an instrument that designates treatment levels for offenders; its use by DV treatment providers is mandated by the Board. Christine recently completed a recidivism study of the Short Term Intensive Residential Remediation Treatment programs for substance abusers, and a recidivism study of offenders released from Community Corrections. Christine staffs the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice and its Drug Policy Task Force. Prior to joining the DCJ research staff, Christine was a research assistant at the Wyoming Statistical Analysis Center where she worked on evaluating the state's Juvenile and Adult Serious and Violent (SVORI) prisoner initiative, drug courts, and the Wyoming Department of Corrections' (WDOC) database infrastructure. Christine also teaches criminal justice courses for the University of Wyoming Outreach program.
