

**Kim English**, research director for the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice since 1993, joined DCJ in 1984. Kim manages a staff of professionals engaged in a variety of research and policy analysis activities including correctional population forecasting, actuarial risk scale development, recidivism studies, policy analysis, and program evaluation. This work includes providing research support to the legislature, the governor's office and the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice. In 1999, Kim received from the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics the G. Paul Sylvestre Award for outstanding achievement in advancing criminal justice statistics in the states. She has consulted with the National Governor's Association, the National Association of State Legislatures, the National Institute of Corrections, the American Probation and Parole Association, the National Institute of Justice, and criminal justice agencies in states across the country. Kim has published scholarly articles in *Quantitative Criminology; Psychology, Public Policy and Law; Corrections Compendium; Criminal Justice and Behavior; Journal of Child Sexual Abuse; Sex Abuse: A Journal of Research and Treatment*, and *Journal of Contemporary Criminal Justice*. She is co-editor of *Managing Adult Sex Offenders in the Community: A Containment Approach*, published by the American Probation and Parole Association. Kim's most recent book chapter is in *Sexual Offenders: Diagnosis, Risk Assessment and Management*, edited by Amy Phenix and Harry Hoberman (2011).
