

Linda Harrison has 25 years of research experience in the fields of substance abuse, delinquency and criminal justice. Linda has been a senior statistical analyst with the Office of Research and Statistics since 2001 and has been responsible for a variety of assignments including program evaluation, risk assessment, recidivism research, correctional population forecasting, and cost and policy analysis. Each December Linda prepares correctional population projections of the Department of Corrections' prison and parole populations, and Division of Youth Corrections' facility and parole populations. Recent accomplishments include a report on Governor Ritter's recidivism reduction initiatives and a revision of the Colorado Sexually Violent Predator Assessment protocol. Her prior experience includes serving as the Director of Research with the Health Resources Consortium, a private research firm, and as a researcher with the Colorado Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division. She has also been a consultant and evaluator for the Denver Juvenile Justice Integrated Treatment Network, the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless, and multiple drug courts in Denver, Tennessee, and New Mexico.
